## At the Edge of the Inside

Some of you may have heard the term "at the edge of the inside," and others may be wondering what this is. Full disclosure, I borrowed the term from Richard Rohr and several others who have discussed it in relation to issues that concerned them. One of the Eight Core Principles, number 4 to be exact, of Rohr's Center for Action and Contemplation is perspective, which he defines as, "Practical truth is more likely found at the bottom and the edges than at the top or the center of most groups, institutions and cultures."

To simplify, there are insiders and outsiders that can be identified in any group, institution and culture. That is a given. But there are also those who remain on the edge of both inside and outside. These are the people who are neither the insiders, "company men," or dues

paying members who are rigid in their hold on tradition and rules and tend to protect and defend the status quo of their system regardless, nor the outsiders who are unbelievers, untouched by internal loyalties and who are more likely to "throw rocks" and scoff at what they do not understand. The people who stand at the edge of the inside are the people who have a crucial role to play.

So, who are the people standing at the edge of the inside? David Brooks sums it up nicely when he says, "these people are within the organization, but they're not subsumed by the group think. They work at the boundaries, bridges and entranceways." Rohr explains that people at the edges of a group "are free from its central seductions, but also free to hear its core message in very new and creative ways." People at the edge of inside are in the unique position to see what is good about the group, but also see what is good about others outside of the group. While they have compassion for and understanding of the hard core insiders, the people on the edge of inside also see the reality of the need to embrace the outsider. Rohr likens it to a carpenter's level where these people on the edge have to "balance the small bubble in the glass between here and there, between yes and no, between loyalty and critique." Brooks states that the people on the edge of inside are "more likely to see wholeness of any situation, to see how us and them, which seem superficially opposed, are actually in complementary relationship within some larger process." The people on the edge are open to change and reform. All institutions need people at the edges. Without them it is difficult to build bridges and connect with other groups, and most important, almost impossible for any institution to grow.

At Middleham and St. Peter's we have people who are at the edge of the inside. I am one of them. Before I read Richard Rohr, David Brooks and others, I was not sure what to call them. I believe that these people are critical to the future of the Episcopal Church and MSP. As insiders hold fast and unyielding to the orthodox, conservative, traditional ways of their church, the outsiders remain unwilling to become a part of that rigidness as it presents itself. The people on the edge of inside respect the tradition of the church, but realize that

without offering something to the outsiders that relates to them in the  $21^{st}$  Century, the church will die.

The Vitality team at Middleham and St. Peter's consists of a dedicated group of people who are on the edge of the inside. They are aware of and fully support the inside traditions, spirit and faith of the Episcopal Church, but they are the core of those who have the insight, imagination and the resolve to recognize that engaging the outsiders, the community, is critical to the well being and future of MSP. They need your help to reach the outsiders in the community and show them that we are more than just church, and that we have a lot to offer them to nurture their spirituality through ministries and fellowship. We ask that you share your love for what we have at Middleham and St. Peter's with anyone and everyone who will then realize that we are everything they never knew they wanted or needed. Have the courage to live on the edge of the inside. The future of the church depends on it and we will all be better for the effort.

## MIDDLEHAM CHAPEL REPAIRS



Following the last wind storm Jim Yoe contacted a Historic building roof repair company to replace the damaged and missing shingles on Middleham Chapel, and do a thorough inspection of the bell tower.

It was determined that the leak in the building was coming from the bell tower due to severe degradation of the support beams and surrounding area. We have contracted to replace the existing roof and repair the bell tower.

Replacing the roof on both chapels was a long range Building for Greater Ministry plan for 2019, but has been moved up to address the issues on the roof.

Work started last week. Scaffolding and ladders will be set up for work on the Bell Tower. How much progress is made will be weather contingent. Overall project is about three weeks.

# New Sacristy Installed in the Parish Hall

During the first week in April, a new sacristy was installed in the parish hall. A sacristy is the area where the items for worship are stored – the eucharist vessels, candles, linens, frontals and other items. It is the area where the altar guild supports the clergy in worship each Sunday and in the seasons throughout the year. Special thanks for the new sacristy is extended to:

To maintain the momentum, build relationships and share information on dismantling racism.


To address identified issues in dismantling racism from the Big Conversation and then focus on these specific issues to inform, educate, motivate and affect change.

**Heart F.E.L.T**. (Feeding Empty Little Tummies). Elizabeth Broadus is doing a wonderful job (did we expect anything less?) heading up the Heart F.E.L.T. backpack program. Presently 31 middle school children are being served at Mill Creek and Southern Middle School. **Haiti School Nurse Program** is back in the picture. Agreements have been made with the Haiti Episcopal Nursing School to initiate a school nursing program with the nursing school and three elementary schools in Leogane, Haiti. The program will start in October 2018. Funding is available from our previous project to start the new program. In addition, a grant has been applied for to add to our funds. Yea for the **Food Drop Program**! In the four years of operating, the number of people being served has passed 20,000. The program, run by Kristen Sandusky and Mark Pesola, (<a href="mailto:kristin.sandusky@gmail.com">kristin.sandusky@gmail.com</a> or <a href="mailto:mark pesola@hotmail.com">mark pesola@hotmail.com</a>), is held monthly and only two months have been missed in the four years. As much as 11,000 lbs. of food has been sorted into family size bags and that is a lot of food! Anything from giant size carrots and all kinds of fresh vegetables to canned good and boxed pasta has arrived on the big truck. Also, frozen meats have been available. Watch for volunteer opportunities at the next Food Drop.

**Helpful Harvest Garden** is about to come alive. On May 6, you are invited to attend the grand massive planting of sweet potatoes! 1500 plants will be arriving the day before and will need to be put in the ground quickly. Just show up with a hand trowel, gloves, a knee pad and hopefully a sun hat will be needed. Numerous other items will eventually be going into the garden as well: tomatoes, peppers, pole beans, marigolds and more. More bees are on order for pollinating and for honey. 
## HeartFELT

Middleham and St. Peter's Parish will have some assistance serving our 32 students as Heart FELT will receive 96 FEMA meal kits via End Hunger of Calvert County for free! The kits were apparently surplus from recent federal disaster support and state officials purchased them for distribution to the food insecure in our state.

#### The kits includes:

2 cans of beef ravioli, 1 bowl of dry cereal, 1 box of shelf stable milk, 3 each 4 ounce cans of fruit, 2 bags of peanuts, 1 bag of sunflower seeds, 4 packs of cookies, 5 packs of crackers, 1 pastry, 2 moist towelettes, and 3 packs of plastic utensils

We will utilize these kits for 3 delivery weeks between now and the end of the school year. There is a potential we will receive more in the future as well. I will pick up the kits this Wednesday May 2nd.
